



Nurses Create a Culture of Humanistic Care

A Q&A with Chief Nurse Executive Theresa Brodrick, Ph.D., RN, NE-BC

Hackensack Meridian Health has made humanizing health care a top priority.

As part of this effort, the network has been focused on expanding face-toface interactions between patients and clinicians, and maximizing the quality of these experiences. Nurses are often at the forefront of these efforts. At Hackensack Meridian *Health*, this is embedded in our nursing culture through a new, unified nursing mission, vision, philosophy and professional practice model.

When Theresa Brodrick started as executive vice president and chief nurse executive in April 2019, she said a central focus was creating a unified nursing team and culture across the network.

With a health system that includes 17 hospitals and 500 other facilities, including ambulatory, assisted living, post-acute care, surgery, urgent care and home health, this was a challenging task.

Question: What steps did you take to create one integrated nursing team and culture?

Answer: As a growing health care system, when we came together as a nursing team, we ended up with eight different mission statements and philosophies, five different practice models and a variety of visions. We simply could not become one nursing team if we all were working off a different playbook. So I

hosted a retreat with nurse leaders from across the network, and together, we developed a unified plan supported by an underlying foundation of humanistic care. No matter where you work in this health care network as a nurse, our mission, vision, philosophy and professional practice model are meant for all of you.

Question: Can you explain more about this foundation of humanistic care and what that means to Hackensack Meridian Health nurses?

Answer: Humanizing health care is an ongoing quality-enhancement process that applies to patients, families, clinicians and other health care professionals. It requires an all-encompassing

understanding of the individual and respecting the fact that each person is unique, with different values, needs and preferences.

As a health network, Hackensack Meridian Health's commitment to humanizing care is exhibited in various ways—from the interdisciplinary team approach at the Hackensack Meridian School of Medicine at Seton Hall University to the design of new spaces at our hospitals that put patients at the center.

As a nursing team, we embrace this and chose to build our nursing practice around Jean Watson's Theory of Human Caring/Caring Science. The core principles of this theory are advanced through our mission, vision, philosophy and professional practice model. This includes caring for one another and our communities, self-care and a healthy practice environment rooted in humanistic care.

Question: Can you tell us more about the new nursing professional practice model? **Answer:** A professional practice model is a framework that supports nurses in their everyday practice. It is a schematic representation of our values/beliefs, professional relationships, patient care delivery and management approach.

For us, our values and beliefs are reflected through the four Cs (see page 3): compassionate, collaborative, creative and courageous. Our professional relationships are demonstrated in the heart-shaped center: patients, families and communities. The heart is held up by hands, the universal symbol for compassion. Patient care delivery is represented around the inner circle: leadership, research, evidence-based practice, professional development, innovation, shared decision-making, and quality and safety. Finally, our management approach—high reliability—is underneath the circle.

Question: In addition to the new mission. vision, philosophy and practice model, you also unveiled a three-year strategic plan for 2020-2022. Why do you need a nursing strategy?

Answer: A strategic plan is the process of defining nursing strategy or direction, and making decisions on the allocation of resources to pursue that strategy. Across the country in health care, we are all challenged to do more with less. A strategic plan provides us with a roadmap and allows us to clearly see where we should put our limited resources to ensure the best outcomes for our patients and nursing team.

Question: Can you explain the key focus areas of your strategic plan?

Answer: Our six strategic areas of focus are:

- Nursing Workforce. We want to strengthen our nursing workforce to become the employer of choice. We will tackle New Jersey first, but we want nurses all across the country to come work for us at Hackensack Meridian Health.
- ► Technology & Innovation. We want to inspire, generate and implement new knowledge, innovation and the use of emerging technology to transform care delivery.
- Nursing Excellence. We will continue to advance a culture of nursing excellence.
- ▶ **Leadership.** We will develop transformational nurse leaders for the future.
- Quality & Safety. We will support a culture of continuous improvement. This is everything that we do as
- **Service.** We will lead Hackensack Meridian *Health* to humanize care for our patients, team members and communities.

Hackensack Meridian Health Nursing & Rehab Opens On-site CNA School

One of the many challenges facing post-acute care facilities is the difficulty recruiting and retaining certified nursing assistants (CNA). Lack of training sites and the financial hardship interested individuals face when trying to attend school and work contribute to the problem. In an effort to meet the challenge, Hackensack Meridian Health Nursing & Rehab at The Harborage partnered with Prestige Medical Solutions and opened an on-site CNA school in August 2019.

The process of setting up a program site included designating classroom and office space, providing medical equipment and supplies, and obtaining approval from the State Departments of Health, Education and Labor. Interested individuals were hired as hospitality aides while they were in school, and all school fees are paid by the facility.

To date, the school has graduated three classes and 13 students have remained at the facility. Classes run year-round.

Among the benefits of working at Hackensack Meridian Health Nursing & Rehab, CNAs are offered excellent compensation, outstanding and affordable benefits for full-time and part-time positions, and flexible schedules and shifts.



Grunin Foundation Gift Advances PCT Programs

In 2019, the Hackensack Meridian Health Meridian **Health Foundation secured** a \$3 million gift from the **Grunin Foundation** to create patient care technician (PCT) preceptorship and apprenticeship programs that will provide a career ladder for team members looking to move into long-term, higherpaying clinical positions such as nursing, while offering growth opportunities for team members who want to build a lifelong career as a PCT, including mentorship

and leadership responsibilities. The programs will also provide employment opportunities for local community members with limited education who want to begin a career in health care.

Due in part to nurses being pulled from the bedside to perform more administrative functions, the Bureau of Labor Statistics has projected that the need for PCTs will grow by more than 18 percent over the next three years. PCTs provide services such as supporting emergency

room patients, reporting vital signs, checking blood pressure and pulse, monitoring patients' conditions and providing updates to the care team. They also provide other direct patient care, including feeding, bathing, ambulating, phlebotomy, obtaining electrocardiograms (EKGs) and finger-stick blood glucose monitoring, as well as serving as emotional support to patients and their families.

"This generous gift by the Grunin Foundation is the first of its kind for Hackensack Meridian *Health*," says Robert C. Garrett, chief executive officer, Hackensack Meridian Health. "PCTs are hands-on at the bedside, taking care of our patients each and

every day, and it's vital that we offer them educational opportunities and a career path as many of them seek to grow in the field of health care. Additionally, this gift will afford team members who may be working in other areas of the network—such as environmental services or food and nutrition—an opportunity to grow in a career while offering additional employment opportunities for our community. It's an incredibly important gift, and I am extremely grateful that the Grunin Foundation recognizes the value that PCTs bring to the patient care experience."

Through educational opportunities and a career path approach, Hackensack Meridian *Health* is proud that many of our PCTs have advanced their careers by becoming registered nurses.

Dawid Debicki, BSN, RN, CRRN, started his career as

The program prepares nurses to generate new knowledge through innovation of practice change, the translation of evidence and the implementation of quality improvement processes. A May 2019 Harvard Business Review article aptly notes, "Every physician can think of a time-probably many-when a nurse has saved the day. And indeed ample research shows that programs that foster a culture of excellent nursing have sweeping impacts throughout health care organizations."

Hackensack Meridian *Health* is proud that seven of our hospitals have earned Magnet® designation, the highest national honor for nursing excellence: Bayshore Medical Center, Hackensack University Medical Center, Jersey Shore University Medical Center, Ocean Medical Center, Raritan Bay Medical Center, Riverview Medical Center and Southern Ocean Medical Center. Developed by the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), a subsidiary of the American Nurses' Association (ANA), this noteworthy distinction

has been achieved by only 9 percent of health care organizations in the United States.

As outlined by the *Harvard Business Review*, the ANCC Magnet Recognition Program® stemmed from a 1983 American Academy of Nursing task force study of the factors that contributed to regional nursing shortages and ways to improve the nursing practice. The task force identified shared characteristics that set apart high-performing hospitals. This ultimately led to the "magnet model"—a framework of five components that helps guide organizations looking to achieve Magnet recognition. The five components are structural empowerment; transformational leadership; exemplary professional practice; new knowledge, innovations and improvements; and empirical outcomes.

Overall, research has consistently demonstrated that Magnet recognition provides specific benefits to health

care organizations and their communities, including:

- Higher patient satisfaction with nurse communication, availability of help and receipt of discharge information
- Lower risk of 30-day mortality and lower failure-to-rescue rates
- Higher job satisfaction among nurses
- Fewer nurse reports of intentions to leave their positions

To achieve Magnet recognition, organizations must pass a demanding and lengthy process that requires widespread participation from leadership and team members. Health care organizations reapply for Magnet recognition every four years based on adherence to Magnet concepts and demonstrated improvements in patient care and quality.

An organization reapplying for Magnet recognition must provide documented evidence to demonstrate how team members sustained and improved Magnet concepts, performance and quality over the four-year period since the organization received its most recent recognition. In addition

to Magnet, the ANCC developed Pathway to Excellence[©], a designation based on the confirmed presence of 12 practice standards essential to an ideal nursing practice environment.

In 2019, Hackensack University Medical Center received Magnet recognition for the sixth time by the ANCC. It is the first hospital in New Jersey to earn this designation six times and the second hospital in the country. Also in 2019, Raritan Bay Medical Center-Old Bridge and Perth Amboy attained Magnet recognition for the fourth time.

Given the significant benefits of this designation, Hackensack Meridian Health is committed to bringing all hospitals in the network on the Magnet/Pathway to Excellence journey in the coming years. To support this rigorous effort, a new Magnet Program Department was created in 2019 under the leadership of Magnet Designation Director Lisa Guinta, MSN, RN-BC, NEA-BC. Using the defined Magnet standards, the network has created a team that promotes nursing excellence and empowerment through shared governance and the professional development of nurses.

Each entity now has a designated Magnet/ Pathway Program coordinator that acts as a liaison for nursing leadership to the ANCC, National Database for Nursing Quality Indicators (NDNQI), nursing staff, physicians and our communities. In this role, the coordinator is charged with promoting the necessary culture changes to increase staff involvement and identify and evaluate data, design, coordinate and/or participate in quality improvement projects promoting evidence-based practice, innovation and collaborative care, showcasing these accomplishments.




New Knowledge, Innovations & Improvements

Nursing Research Studies

Recent Monmouth University Doctor of Nursing Practice graduate Dr. Christine Devine, who serves as network director of Ambulatory Quality & Patient Safety, was honored with the 2019 DNP Leadership Award from Monmouth University School of Nursing for outstanding DNP research project and academic excellence.

The purpose of her research project—"The Effect of an Education Program on Perception of the Work Environment in Primary Care Team Members in a Patient-centered Medical Home"—was to examine if there was a change in perception of work environment in primary care team members following the guided integration of patient-centered medical home workflows. This guided integration was introduced through facilitated transformation, utilizing the techniques and applied adaptive methods learned in TeamSTEPPS (Team Strategies & Tools to Enhance Performance & Patient Safety).

Hackensack Meridian Health nurse scientist Kathryn Fleming, Ph.D., RN, CPHQ, NEA-BC, FACHE, served as principal investigator for research completed at Ocean Medical Center entitled, "Measurement and Comparison of Compassion Satisfaction, Burnout and Secondary Stress in a Community Hospital Before, During and After Implementation of a Compassion Fatigue Program for Nurses using the ART Model." Sub-principal investigators from the network included Grace Mazzatta.

MSN, APN, ANP-BC, ACHPN; physical therapist Jennifer Eberle; and social worker Katie Matarese.

The longitudinal mixed-method study explored the staff's perspective of integrative health practices. It was a convenience sample from participants at Ocean Medical Center. Within the control group, 82 percent were female respondents, 39 percent were registered nurses, and 37 percent had experience with more than 10 patients dying each

week. The intervention group had 100 percent of female respondents, 80 percent of whom were registered nurses and 40 percent of whom had experience with more than 10 patients dving each week. Secondary trauma and burnout had a statistically significant higher rate in the intervention group when compared to the control group. In addition, gender had statistically significant differences in all areas measured (compassion satisfaction, secondary trauma and burnout). Men had higher compassion satisfaction and lower secondary trauma and burnout when compared to women.

Melissa Harker, DNP, MSN, RN-BC, CNEcl, AHN-BC, HMCP, manager of education and training, Integrative Health and Medicine, completed research at Jersey Shore University Medical Center as principal investigator. The study, "Clinical and Cultural Competency for LGBTQIA Patients," examined the ability to implement care initiatives that overcome behavioral dimensions

of homophobic responses among health care providers.

The project addressed the current challenge for advanced practice nurse leaders to overcome the lack of culturally competent care curricula for LGBTQIA patient care. The implementation of a flipped classroom approach to education created a learning environment that was optimal for internalizing the care needs of LGBTQIA patients. The project demonstrated

that clinicians can read and internalize on their own, which gives the learner time to process and become comfortable, especially with sensitive content related to gender minorities. The ability to use the classroom teaching time for a series of case studies allows for simulated role play using terminology and standards of care. Clinicians not only internalized the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association's (GLMA) standards of care but also internalized how heterosexism impacts their work environment and ability to provide culturally competent care. The project validated the need to establish standardized terminology among professionals communicating about the care needs of LGBTQIA patients.

Claudia Douglas, DNP, RN, APN-C, administrative director of the Institute for Evidence-based Practice and Nursing Research at Hackensack University Medical Center, completed a range of research in 2019, serving as both principal and co-investigator. Research included:

- National Hospital Care Survey (principal investigator)
- ▶ What Made You Tell? Factors Impacting Child Sexual Abuse Disclosure—WATCH (co-investigator)
- Congestive Heart Failure and Cardiac Rehabilitation (COACH) Study (co-investigator)
- ► Central Venous Catheter Access Documentation Study—a retrospective study (principal investigator)
- Impact of a Multidisciplinary Approach in a Congestive Heart Failure Unit on Patient Outcomes— IMACH (co-investigator)
- Parkinson's Disease Inpatient Clinical Knowledge and Management—PICK (co-investigator)

Four-year HRSA Award Will **Enhance Nurse Practitioner Residency Program**

The leadership of the nursing team helped secure a four-year, \$3.4 million award from the Health Resources & Services Administration (HRSA) to launch a comprehensive nurse practitioner residency program. Funding under this initiative is geared to both planning for new program development and expanding existing postgraduate nurse practitioner residency programs.

In partnership with its academic partner, Monmouth University, Hackensack Meridian Health will operationalize a rigorous nurse practitioner residency program in community-based primary care practices in the New Jersev counties of Atlantic. Monmouth, Ocean, Middlesex and Bergen. Nurse practitioner Grace Mazzatta is the principal investigator on this grant.

"Hackensack Meridian Health's Nurse Practitioner Residency Program will increase and fine-tune health care skills through hands-on training with the presence and guidance of trained preceptors," says Theresa M. Brodrick. Ph.D., RN, NE-BC. executive vice president and chief nurse executive at Hackensack Meridian Health. "Ten nurse practitioners a year in years two to four will participate in 12-month, full-time residency programs, designed to fortify their clinical knowledge and advance their skills to work more effectively with the patients we care for and enhance our overall capacity to meet the needs of the communities we serve."

Quality Improvement Initiative

Alyssa Gonzalez, BSN, RN, PCCN, Hackensack University Medical Center, led a multidisciplinary project (2018–2019) to reduce surgical site infections in postoperative CABG patients. The multidisciplinary project included changes to practices and policies as well as education. The final result was a nurse-led, evidence-based and standardized skin preparation protocol resulting in 0 percent infection rate within six months after implementation. These results were connected to autonomous nursing practice, reduction in preventable infections, reduction in length of stay and 30-day readmissions, and reduction in cost, while simultaneously positively impacting nurse and patient satisfaction.

Publications

Suzanne Courtwright, MSN, NP, NEA-BC, Magnet® program director at JFK University Medical Center, published "Emotional Well-being in Youth: A Concept Analysis" (https://doi.org/10.1111/ nuf.12404) along with Mary Beth Flynn Makic, Ph.D., RN, CCNS, CCRN-K, FAAN, FANP, CNS, and Jacqueline Jones, Ph.D., RN, FAAN. The aim was to report a synthesis of the extant literature and define emotional well-being in youth as a concept of emerging importance. The conclusion notes, "Attributes of emotional well-being in youth include overall positive emotions, positive selfesteem and resilience. Antecedents are safe and stable nurturing relationships; family and social connectedness, hope and positive body-image. The consequences of emotional well-being in youth include self-efficacy, self-actualization, the presence of positive health behaviors and the absence of high-risk behaviors."

Rosalie Grantoza, DNP, MBA, MSN, BSN, RN-BC, CCRN, director of nursing at Raritan Bay Medical Center-Old Bridge, published "The Courage to Speak Out: a study describing nurses' attitudes to report unsafe practices in patient care," which appeared in the Journal of Nursing Management (https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/31077621). Co-authors included **Donna Cole**. **Eileen Besick**. Anita Skartek, Kathleen Cummins and Kendra **Dugan**. The aim was to identify workplace factors that influence patient advocacy among registered nurses and their willingness to report unsafe practices. The conclusion notes, "Although RNs may not have personally experienced workplace retaliation, fear of retaliation when reporting unsafe patient-care practices still exists. Nursing leadership's ability to facilitate a culture of safety by proactively addressing unsafe practices fosters a level of comfort for patient advocacy and willingness to report issues. Education, professional associations and existing protection laws are available resources, which contribute to organizational support systems."

Dr. Amanda Hessels Secures Prestigious R18 Research **Demonstration and Dissemination Grant**

Hackensack Meridian Health nurse scientist Amanda Hessels. Ph.D., MPH, RN, CIC, CPHQ, FAPIC, of the Ann May Center for Nursing and Allied Health, secured \$1.86 million in funding from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, a unit of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. The funding is provided through a five-year R18 Research Demonstration and Dissemination grant. The joint project with Columbia University, where Dr. Hessels serves as an assistant professor, also will include two co-investigators from Hackensack Meridian Health: Christine Hader, DNP, RN-BC, CPAN, CCRN-K; and Kristine Monia, DNP, RN, CEN.

The study will test a simulation intervention designed to improve provider performance of standard precautions and prevent health care-associated infections (HAIs) and occupational blood-borne pathogen exposures. Dr. Hessels says, "Despite well-established guidelines and training, standard precautions are not reliably practiced, with self-reported adherence among nurses, who have the most direct patient contact in acute care, at less than 50 percent. HAIs are a substantial public health problem affecting approximately 2 million patients annually, and every year, one in 25 registered nurses are exposed to blood-borne pathogens. We think simulation training may improve standard precaution adherence and ultimately improve health care quality and safety for patients and providers."

Kristin Hayden, MSN, RN-BC, Hackensack University Medical Center, provided a poster presentation at the National Cardiovascular Data Registry Conference in New Orleans in March 2019 titled, "The Impact of the APNs on Discharge Medication Compliance in the Post-PCI Patients." She also provided a poster presentation at the HMH Quality Research Conference in May 2019.

Rocel Besa, Ph.D., RN-BC, CNE, Jersey Shore University Medical Center, provided a poster presentation, "How a Jolt of Appreciation Re-engaged Preceptors to Successful Onboarding," at various conferences, including Organization of Nurse Leaders, Princeton, New Jersey; Institute of Healthcare Improvement, San Francisco; Philippine Nurses Association of New Jersey, Edison, New Jersey; Philippine Nurses Association of America, Atlanta; Professional Nurse Educator Group of Cleveland Clinic, Cleveland; and Lambda Delta Chapter, Monmouth University, Long Branch, New Jersey.

Community Outreach Nurses Critical to Take Vape Away Campaign

In 2019, Hackensack Meridian Health announced its Take Vape Away campaign, a \$1 million strategy to address the vaping epidemic. The campaign includes grants to school districts and community groups to launch buy-back programs, as well as educational outreach and other strategies to combat vaping among middle school and high school students.

The strategy to address the epidemic includes:

- ► A grant program for local school districts and community organizations to institute measures to combat vaping, which includes launching buyback programs or developing new programs.
- Working with the New Jersey Mental Health and Addiction Agencies to educate youth about the perils of vaping.
- Launching a public health study conducted by the Hackensack Meridian School of Medicine at Seton Hall University to identify the health impact from vaping and identify best practices to combat the epidemic.
- ► Training 50 nurses to reach students at 100 schools to alert them of the perils of e-cigarettes.

Today, more than 50 community outreach nurses remain available to deliver the "Don't Get Vaped In" curriculum. This program, developed by Tobacco Free for a Healthy NJ, teaches about the dangers of vaping and offers resources to quit.

The 45-minute program can be delivered in a class, an assembly or other meeting for students in grades 6-12. Handouts are provided for students about the dangers of vaping. The adult version of the handout covers not only the dangers, but also information about vaping products, the signs of vaping in children, understanding addiction and tips on talking to teens.

In 2019 alone, this initiative reached nearly 4,390 kids from 15 schools across New Jersey. In addition, community outreach nurses hosted nine adult education sessions, with participation from parents, school nurses and other educators.

"As we look to tackle the exponential growth in the number of adolescents vaping, our community outreach nurses play a vital role by providing the education and tools necessary to help stop this epidemic," says Executive Vice President and Chief Nursing Executive Theresa Brodrick, Ph.D., RN, NE-BC.

Giving Back Through Community and Military Service

Nurses Lead the Way to Combat Human Trafficking

Statistics reveal that nurses are vital to the identification of human trafficking victims.

An estimated 12 million to 30 million people are impacted by human trafficking globally, with 88 percent of trafficked victims having contact with a health care provider. Nurses are some of the only professionals that interact with victims while they are still in captivity. According to the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, one of the most challenging issues associated with human trafficking for nurses and other clinicians is the identification of victims.

Because nurses are uniquely positioned to screen, identify and care for victims of human trafficking, Hackensack Meridian *Health* nurses have been at the forefront of efforts to ensure improved education and awareness. In fact, Hackensack Meridian *Health* is one of only six Integrated Delivery Healthcare Systems in the country to make up the Global Strategic Operatives for the Eradication of Human Trafficking (GSOEHT), which was initiated at the

United Nations in 2018. As part of this initiative, the six health care systems are working to adopt a groundbreaking human trafficking training and research initiative.

Under the leadership of Executive Vice President and Chief Nursing Executive Theresa Brodrick, Ph.D., RN, NE-BC, Hackensack Meridian Health's representative for this critical initiative is Kristina Rioux, MSN, RN, CEN, CCRN, NPD-BC, who serves as a nurse manager for the Emergency Trauma Department at Hackensack University Medical Center.

According to Theresa, "With an estimated 88 percent of victims seeking medical care or treatment while being trafficked, training and knowledge is essential to ensuring that our clinicians appropriately diagnose these individuals. Given New Jersey's location and dense population, the state is particularly vulnerable to this global epidemic."

The vision of the GSOEHT is the eradication of all forms of human trafficking, including sexual

exploitation, labor trafficking and organ harvesting. CommonSpirit Health has been a pioneer in the area of human trafficking training for health care providers, and now, together with Selah Freedom, leads the GSO educational efforts for this initiative. These trainings are intended to ensure that all staff can identify victims of human trafficking and take appropriate action internally, with community agencies and with law enforcement to get them the help they need.

To launch this initiative at Hackensack Meridian Health, Kristina worked collaboratively with a host of local, state and federal agencies, including the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice and the Bergen County Prosecutors Office. As a first step, a strategic leadership meeting was held in December 2019 to support the education roll-out. This was facilitated by the co-founder and director of the GSO, Deb O'Hara Rusckowski, and the director of International Health & Human Trafficking-Dignity Health, Petra Linden. This meeting was attended by multiple disciplines and governmental and non-governmental representatives, including the U.S. Department of Justice, the FBI, local and state officials, the Bergen County Council of Churches, Bergen County Housing, Health and Human Services, and the Center for Hope and Safety.

The robust, comprehensive GSOEHT program includes Level One Training, which involves a survivor-taught presentation, local legal information,

on-site clinical review-developed protocol and the PEARR (Provide Privacy, Educate, Ask, Respect and Respond) Tool, which is a suite of procedures to guide practitioners in assisting possible abuse victims. The Level Two Training focuses on clinicians who will have direct contact with the trafficked victim, with emphasis on a "train-the-trainer" model. In addition, a research component lasts for one year.

In addition to Hackensack Meridian *Health*, other health care systems involved include RWJBarnabas. Advocate Aurora Health, Baptist Health, Harris Health System/Baylor College of Medicine and Northwell Health.

GSOEHT marks the most significant step the health care industry has taken to address the human trafficking crisis within our borders. The education and training roll-out will continue across the Hackensack Meridian Health network in 2020.

"We are proud that this is another critical initiative that Hackensack Meridian Health nurses are leading. We look forward to ensuring that all of our clinicians are armed with the information needed to help identify and treat these victims, and do our part to combat human trafficking," Theresa says.

Warning Signs of Human **Trafficking**

- Appearing malnourished
- Showing signs of physical injuries and abuse
- Avoiding eye contact, social interaction and authority figures/law enforcement
- Seeming to adhere to scripted or rehearsed responses in social interaction
- Lacking official identification documents
- Appearing destitute/lacking personal possessions
- Poor physical or dental health
- Tattoos/branding on the neck and/or lower
- Untreated sexually transmitted diseases
- Not allowing people to go into public alone or speak for themselves

Foundation Awards and Scholarships **Recognize Nurses**

Hackensack Meridian Health recognizes the efforts and achievements of its nursing staff through various awards and scholarship programs.

This financial support assists those who are preparing to enter the nursing profession as well as nurses who are seeking advanced degrees. We also fund special projects that have the potential to improve patient, institutional and professional outcomes. In 2019, 295 scholarships were provided for a total of \$243,750.

In September 2019, the Barbara Forfar Nursing Scholarship Fund Advisory Committee announced they awarded nursing scholarships to three nurses at Ocean Medical Center. The 2019 ceremony marks nine consecutive years that scholarships have been awarded to Ocean team members from this scholarship fund. In total, the fund has awarded \$18,500 to 33 Ocean nurses and nursing students.

The Barbara Forfar Nursing Scholarship Fund was established to honor the memory of longtime Point Pleasant resident Barbara Forfar—or "Foof" as she was called by her fellow nurses and other colleagues in the operating room—and her 44 years of dedication to the nursing profession. The fund provides monetary assistance to qualified nurses and nursing students of Ocean who desire to continue their formal education.

The 2019 Barbara Forfar Nursing Scholarship awardees include:

Susan McKenna, who has been employed with Hackensack Meridian Health for 22 years. She began her career at Ocean in 1997 as a unit secretary in the Surgical Intensive Care Unit before becoming a patient care technician and then moving into the Emergency Room. Susan holds BLS, ACLS and PALS certifications, and is telemetry-certified. Susan recently completed her BSN degree at Chamberlain University School of Nursing.

Kathleen Scalzo, who is pursuing her BSN at Georgian Court University with an anticipated completion date of May 2020. Kathleen is a long-term, valued CCU team member at Ocean

who is also PACU-certified. Kathleen is also the co-chairperson of the Shared Governance Committee and a member of the Critical Care Education & Policy Committee and Community Education Committee. Her ultimate goal is to obtain her MSN degree and help teach the novice nurses of our community.

RN Ken Rodenbaugh Exposes **Dangers of Substance Abuse**

Ken Rodenbaugh, RN, CARN, CEN, a nurse in the Southern Ocean Medical Center Emergency Department, uses his personal experience when he educates his fellow nurses and students in the community about the dangers of substance abuse.

Terminated from a previous job for diversion of narcotics, Ken entered rehab, where he learned about the Recovery and Monitoring Program (RAMP), a program in New Jersey that supports nurses fighting substance abuse through treatment and returning to work. RAMP is managed by the Institute for Nursing and New Jersey Board of Nursing.

Ken has said, "There's almost no education on RAMP, and that's what really fired me up. I was a nurse for seven years, and not one person told me about it."

To ensure other nurses were aware of this vital resource, Ken collaborated with RAMP to develop a presentation that teaches nurses and hospital teams to recognize signs of drug

diversion and addiction among their peers, and how they can help by reporting them. He now gives his presentation to every nurse who is hired at Hackensack Meridian Health, as well as at conferences around the country and through his personal website.

Ken's dedication extends outside of the hospital and into the classroom. Ken is the coordinator of Project Aware, a dramatic presentation that educates sixth-graders about the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse. The presentation realistically portrays the events of a single night, where kids are at a party and one of them overdoses. Students watching the presentation are even bused to the hospital, where they have a front-row view of the Emergency Department as doctors and nurses work to save the kid's life.

Since its inception over 20 years ago, nearly 6,000 sixth-grade students have experienced this dramatic presentation that helps them make the "right" choice and aims to reduce the incidences of overdose and deaths in the community. Project Aware is expanding to more schools in Ocean and Monmouth counties in the

In addition to sharing his story of recovery with thousands of nurses and students. Ken has been an emergency medicine and mental health nurse for more than 13 years, earning national certifications in both addictions nursing and emergency nursing. In 2019, he was named to the third class of the New Jersey Healthcare Executive Leadership Academy (NJHELA), a joint initiative to build stronger leadership among physicians and executives from hospitals, post-acute providers and health plans. The NJHELA was developed by the Medical Society of New Jersey, the New Jersey Association of Health Plans and the New Jersey Hospital Association. Congratulations, Ken!



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
